

Limguistic Phonics Program-SSP


The Speech Sound Pics (SSP) Approach is an approach to teaching reading, writing and spelling in a 1:1, small group or whole class setting. It is primarily a 'Linguistic Phonics' program, which is a 'Speech (sounds) to Print' approach; we start from the sounds in our speech and teach the spelling choices that were invented to represent the sounds in the language. SSP is also a Visual Phonics program, as students can use the Speech Sound Monsters to know Which speech sound each segmented grapheme (Sound Pic) represents.

Linguistic Phonics Program- Code Mapping




Why we teach this way.







Linguistic Phonics Program- Why we teach this way.











Speech Sound Pictographs offer a DIRECT link between the Speech Sound and Speech Sound Pic (grapheme)

They are not confused when they see the letter with different Speech Sound Pictographs.

Within traditional programs they are only shown ONE link, and are expected to recall the associated word, and have the phonemic awareness to isolate that speech sound from the others in the target word (to understand why that picture was used) Even if 'first sound' this can be a struggle for children with poor phonemic awareness eg those with dyslexia.







Homework - Reading

Reading each night

- Remember reading is not just about getting the words right.
- Ask questions, check for comprehension

Reading strategies, we are using in class:

- Activate prior knowledge
- Predicting
- Questioning
- Making connections
- Visualizing
- Inferring



- 4 readers will come home on Monday, to be returned on Friday.
- Record reading for each night in the Reading Log and return the Reading Log daily in your child's homework folder.
- Library books will come home on Friday and can be read anytime throughout the week with students. These are great for modelling reading to your children. These do not need to be recorded.





Homework – Spelling Words

Spelling words are 'sound' words based on the weekly SSP sound. They can ALL be code-mapped (duck hands, lines and numbers). We use the monsters and the sounds we hear to work out which letters represent the speech-sound. We then explore in the cloud for the spelling option.

Words will be tested on a Friday in our Test Booklets, at school.








Reporting and Assessing
